The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Bernardino, at its regular meeting on **Tuesday, November 6, 2018**, will conduct a public hearing to consider an amendment to the Renewable Energy and Conservation Element (RECE) of the County General Plan. The proposed amendment would add the original Policy 4.10, a policy that would limit the areas where utility-oriented renewable energy projects will be permitted. AREA OF EFFECT: Countywide.

Honorable San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors:


